Administrative Order

I. Designation of Administrative Hearing Officer and Probable Cause Hearing Officer

This Court shall act as the Administrative Hearing Officer to perform the functions outlined in the Arizona Supreme Court's Administrative Order 95-60 as they relate to:

- A. Imposition of La Paz County Arizona Terms of Probation on newly accepted from other states.
- B. Probable Cause Determination

II. Procedure for Implementation and Empowering La Paz County Arizona Terms of Probation

- A. The Adult Probation Department, after assessing acceptance of any Interstate Compact Case, shall file a Petition for Administrative Hearing Related to Interstate Probation, imposing Terms and Conditions of Probation Supervision as outlined in Probation Departmental Policy S-14.
- B. Clerk shall assign an Interstate Compact (IS) number to the defendant's case.
- C. The Probation Department shall obtain a hearing date from the Court and issue a Notice of Hearing.
- D. The Court at the hearing will inform the transferee of La Paz County, Arizona terms of probation it deems appropriate.

III. Interstate Compact Fees


- A. At the time of the Administrative Hearing a monthly supervision fee of no less than \$30.00, unless the Court requires a lesser amount, for deposit in the Victim Assistance Fund established pursuant to A.R.S. §§ 41-2408 and 31-466, shall be imposed and paid to the Clerk of the Superior Court.

- B. If acceptance of the case is between the 1st and 15th of the month, supervision fees are due for that month. If acceptance of the case is between the 16th and 31st of the month, then the supervision fees will be due for the following month.

IV. Violations

- A. In the event of a Violation of Probation of either the La Paz County, Arizona, terms of probation or sending state's terms of probation, the Probation Department shall follow its normal policies and procedures outlined in Section S-9, S-10, and S-25 of the Department's Policy Manual.
- B. Upon the filing of a Petition to Revoke for a hearing to determine probable cause shall be set within a reasonable time frame unless:
1. The defendant waives the hearing, or
 2. The defendant is in custody, then the hearing should be within 15 days of arrest.
