Administrative Order No. 2008-001

Whereas, the Arizona Supreme Court, Superior Court and Clerk of Court have taken measures to protect sensitive data of parties in family court cases, and, Rule changes effective January 1, 2008, protect this information on both Orders of Assignment and Orders to Stop Order of Assignment (Stop Orders). However, from January 1, 2006, through December 31, 2007, Stop Orders were not included as confidential documents. Stop Orders, in both language and format, include the same sensitive data that is currently protected on Orders of Assignment.

As the clerk of the Superior Court in La Paz County maintains electronic records, it is possible that, without judicial intervention, Orders to Stop Order of Assignment could be more widely available than necessary. This Administrative Order accomplishes the rule's intent that public access to sensitive data be limited to the extent possible. Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED:

- Orders to Stop Order of Assignment filed on or after January 1, 2006, when the Arizona Rules of Family Law Procedure were implemented, shall contain any sensitive data required by law, but shall be confidential and only available to the parties, the parties' attorneys, the parties' employers, child support enforcement agencies, court personnel, and any other person or agency authorized by court order.
- 2. In the discretion of the clerk, Orders to Stop Order of Assignment may be maintained either in paper or electronic format. If these documents are maintained electronically, the clerk is authorized to destroy any paper versions.

3. The retroactive effect of this Order shall not cause the clerk to be liable for those Orders to Stop Order of Assignment filed on or after January 1, 2006 that may have been accessed as public records prior to the implementation of this Order.
